9. Drink milk that goes into Muller Yogurts (Henhull Hall, Nantwich).
10. Thrill the children with pygmy goats and mini Shetland ponies (Sandhole farm, Hulme Walfield, Congleton).
11. Stay where an episode of soap opera Hollyoaks was made (Ash House Farm, Acton Bridge, Northwich).
12. Take part in a fishing match for adults (Goose Green, Mottram St Andrew, Macclesfield).
13. Watch a peacock display its feathers during breakfast (Lea Farm, Wybunbury, Nantwich).
